#### A New Vision for West Contra Costa County

BBK launched itself into a new mission, vision and set of values as inspired by the input of community residents on the topics of health and education.



#### **Elevate Youth Genius**

Richmond youth participated in our free weekly after-school Coding and STEM club and our Minecraft summer camp.

#### Increase Community Decision Makers

The first cohort of Community Educational Leadership Institute (CELI) fellows prepared to lead local and regional boards, commissions and committees.





#### Create Spaces for Wellness and Self-Care

Black and Latinx women participated in peer support groups and learned easy and culturally sensitive ways of taking care of themselves and their families.

#### Host Fun and Educational Summer Experiences

Free lunches were distributed to youth under 18. Weekly parents, caregivers, and children participated in playgroups, accessed free produce and food, moved with Zumba, created art, and obtained skills to boost summer learning.
